Tuesday Tidings

Excerpt from SFS Morning Chapel Reading

*Keep your heart with all vigilance, for from it flow the springs of life.
– Proverbs 4:23*

There are rivers of water below ground much like the rivers above the ground. Wells are dug to reach this underground supply and provide water for us to drink. Sometimes these underground rivers bubble up at the surface out of a crack in a rock. We call this a spring. If the spring water is clean, plants will grow abundantly around it and animals will come to the spring to drink. But if the earth below is contaminated with poisons like oil or radiation, the water could be deadly to drink.

Our speech is like a river flowing from our hearts below. Wrong words and actions spring from a heart that is not loving or obeying God. That is why it is important to pay attention to what is going on inside you. If you think sinful things, sooner or later they will come out as sinful speech or actions. Take for example a boy who wants with all his heart to go out and play. What happens when his mom tells him that he must finish his schoolwork before he can go out to play? What do you think might spring from his heart?

While it is important to keep watch over our hearts, none of us has the power to change a sinful heart of stone that doesn't love God or want to follow his commands, into a soft heart that loves him. God is the only one who can change our heart. God sent his only Son Jesus to live a perfect life, and then die on the cross for our sin. When we place our trust in Jesus and ask him for forgiveness, the Spirit of God give us a new heart, one that wants to obey and honor God. Once that happens, the words that spring up out of our hearts begin to change as we learn to live for God.
