Last week in morning chapel, Mrs. Rivers and the students finished reading *Wise Up: 10-Minute Family Devotions in Proverbs*. The final theme of the book was “God is Love: Loving as God Loves.” Below is one of the final devotions.

Hatred stirs up conflict, but love covers over all wrongs. – Proverbs 10:12(NIV)

What if a small child got hold of a permanent black marker and scribbled all over one of the walls in your house? What would you do? You can’t clean permanent marker off the walls. There is only one solution: cover up the black marks with paint.

Today’s proverb tells us that if you love someone, you will cover up the wrongs they do. Just like paint covers the black marks, when we forgive someone for hurting us, we cover over their sin and choose to live as though it never happened.

Showing anger or hatred toward a person for sinning against us leads to conflict, which is kind of like a fight. Think of a baseball pitcher who hits a batter with the ball. If the batter charges the pitcher in anger, it usually leads to all kinds of problems. The rest of the players might jump onto the field to fight, and the batter could be thrown out of the game. But if he covers the offense of the pitcher for hitting him and just walks to first base, the game can continue without a problem.

In the same way, God wants us to really love other by covering the wrong they’ve done to us. Remember, God covered over our sins. He wants us to treat others the way we ourselves have been treated.
